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## 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

### 5.1 Extinguishing Media:

Water, Foam, Dry Powder or Carbon dioxide can be used.

### 5.2 Specific Hazards Arising From the Substance Or Mixture:

As the product contains small amounts of combustible organic components, fire will produce hazardous products of combustion such as carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide, nitrogen oxides, metal oxides, ammonia or halogenated compounds.

In case of inhalation of decomposition products in a fire, symptoms may be delayed. The exposed person may need to be kept under medical surveillance for 48 hours.

### 5.3 Advice for Fire Fighters:

Wear full protective clothing and self-contained breathing apparatus if required.

### Further Information:

Do not allow run-off from fire fighting to enter drains or water courses.

In a fire or if heated, pressure increase will occur and the container may burst. Cool closed containers exposed to fire with water spray.
